WASTING TIME

A FULL YEAR after Chief Minister Jon Stanhope promised Canberrans an annual hard waste collection day, the ACT Government is yet to implement a plan.

The news comes as the Government rubbishes former Liberal MLA Jacqui Burke's call to offer Canberra households two free visits to the tip every year.

Govt rubbishes free tip trip proposal

Mrs Burke said free tip visits could address the problem of furniture and waste dumped outside Canberra's charity shops.

The Department of Territory and Municipal Services said it would not offer free trips to the tip. Instead, it

was "actively considering" a trial of hard waste collection but was yet to decide on a permanent arrangement.

Mr Stanhope announced in January 2009 the Government would introduce an annual hard rubbish

collection day "within a year". "We have also committed to an annual collection of hard waste on an individual basis," he said.
